

  - i. The poem expresses the significance of small things in changing one's attitude. The dust of snow changed the poet's mood and saved many precious moments from being wasted away.

A. (A) 'From the Diary of Anne Frank' describes the teacher- student relationship, class atmosphere and discipline. It is an excerpt from the novel 'Diary of a Young Girl' which justifies this. In the story, Anne Frank writes about an incident which came out to be beneficial for her. She tells her readers that she used to talk a lot in the class and so got punished by Mr.Keesing, her Maths teacher. As a punishment, she was asked to write essays which were in fact learning in disguise because he wanted her to focus on studies. He cannot be blamed for the punishment as he did it for Anne's betterment. The classroom plot of the story indicates that the teacher student relationship is very respectful and sacred. It is about discipline and classroom manners which is essential for every student as well as teacher, otherwise both teaching and learning would be hampered. This relationship is clearly shown by the actions of both Keesing and Anne Frank as they both try to joke with each other but in very humorous and healthy manner.

A. (B) In the play 'The Proposal' Anton Chekhov conveys the message that the principle of 'forgive and forget' helps a lot in maintaining cordial relationship among neighbours. Initially, the neighbours in the play, Lomov, Natalya and Chubukov were fighting over petty issues. They were putting important issues behind them and wasting their time by arguing over small irrelevant things. These arguments slowly developed into fights and they started hurling abuses at one another. Consequently, not only was the matter of importance forgotten

but this also damaged their relationship with each other. It was when Natalya came to know that Lomov had come to propose her that she left the topic of argument behind. She also asked for forgiveness and tried to forget the issue of the argument. All of this soon culminated into the proposal which was readily accepted. Hence, 'forgive and forget' is a mandatory principle that one must follow to maintain cordial relationships with others.

In the story, 'The Hack Driver' Oliver Lutkins using this characteristic of the lawyer makes him a fool throughout his first visit to the village. First he introduced himself as Bill at the railway station and assured the lawyer that they would search for Lutkins together as he knew most of the places where Lutkins used to hangout. He deceived the lawyer throughout and also made money by taking him around. The gullible lawyer trusted him blindly and made himself look foolish.

(B) The given quote by E.E.Hale points out that each and every individual is important and unique. No one is less than the other irrespective of all differences. This fact is very evidently posited by the story 'Bholi'.

In the story, Bholi shows the transformation from a little girl who has no self- worth to an independent girl who believed in herself. As a young child, Bholi was treated differently from other brothers and sisters. She wasn't given much attention and care. People thought that she lacked sense. Her stammering made her submissive. This made her so meek that she compared herself to a 'dumb cow'.

Her perception regarding herself started changing when she started going to school. In school, her teacher guided her. She encouraged Bholi towards getting educated. As a result, not only did Bholi overcome her stammering but also became confident and developed a sense of self- esteem. As she grew up, she became a masterpiece who did not succumb to the greedy demands of the prospective groom and spoke out for herself.

This journey of Bholi's growth clearly showcases that an individual should not be exploited by people or circumstances. Instead, one should evolve to become a person who is proactive and contributing to the well- being of others around.
